










UN-SWAP Gender Equality Scorecard





Eight UN Joint Programmes Focused on Leaving No One Behind (LNOB)




The UN funding gap by Sustainable Development Goal in Viet Nam




Required, Available, and Expenditure by Priority Outcomes




Number of Programmatic Interventions Targeting LNOB Groups



Expenditure by UN Entity


